Right into the modern era, blue-and-white Chinese porcelain, in particular, exerted a marked influence on the work of Muslim potters.

The models were luxury items manufactured in China and “tailor made” for the Islamic upper class in large parts of Asia. This *huqqa*, or water pipe, was made especially for the Indian market.
