Where figurative elements are found in decoration in the Islamic world, they are often used as ornaments. The most common true-tolife depictions are stylized renditions of animals and human figures, but virtually all motifs can be found in illustrations for scientific and literary works.

This tile provides a good example of the subtle II-Khanid blending of human figures and plant forms. First a simple plant motif was painted in blue on a white background. Not until lustre was added were the figures given depth and body. We do not know whether they are wellknown characters from Persian literature or were intended to be purely decorative.
