THE DANISH INSTITUTE, 2000

Following a complete restoration Bayt al-Aqqad was inaugurated in October 2000 as the domicile of the Danish Institute.

In the Oriental rooms of the house Danish furniture and lighting are a reminder to the visitor of the Danish connection. An important role in the function of the house is played by the “historical” rooms. This means, for example, that symposia and readings may be held in the Mamluk *qa'a*, less than two metres above the stage of the Roman theatre of Herod the Great.
